Check	Your Pet Is Good To Go	How You Can Help	Your Pet Needs To Go To The Veterinarian
Ears	Pink and Smell Good	Wax debris - clean with ear wash	Foul odor, redness or ear mites which look like coffee grounds
Eyes	Bright & clear, pupils are equally dilated & responsive; no excessive tearing	Excessive Tearing - Flush with saline solution or eye wash	Cloudiness to eyes; one pupil larger than the other; excessive tearing not alleviated by saline solution or eye wash; squinting or pawing at eye.
Nose	Shiny & Moist		Dry & cracked excessively dripping; mucus discharge; sneezing; open wound.
Mouth	Clean white teeth with no bad odor; scissor bite from teeth meeting properly; pink moist gums with CRTs 2 seconds	Brush daily with pet specific toothpaste. Keep pet well hydrated.	Foul odor, tartar build up; redness obvious absess or loose teeth; uneven bite; brightened, blue, pale or white; dry or tacky gums.
Skin & Coat	Shiny, no lumps, or bumps or flakes; healthy pink; no hair loss.	Bathe, brush regularly & add Omega 3s to your dog's diet.	Lumps, bumps, scabs, open sores; bald spots or extreme hair loss.
Legs & Paws	When walking, gait is smooth & even. No cuts to pads; nails short; cat stands and moves well with no tenderness. Did you know cats have 5 toes on the front paws and 4 on the back? Those with more are referred to as polydactyl.	Clean any pads wounds. Don't let them walk on hot or extremely cold surfaces; trim nails; exercise.	Open wounds; limping; unsteadiness; difficulty walking;, getting up or lying down; dragging a limb.
Chest & Abdomen	Pink skin, no lumps, bumps or tender areas.; you can feel ribs but not see them and chest is lower than the tummy	Keep your pet at a healthy weight.	Any lumps or tenderness; need to lose excessive weight.
Heart	Steady even rythm. 60 - 160 Beats Per Minute for Medium to Large Dogs 90-220 Beats Pet Minute for small dogs and cats	Get regular veterinary check ups and appropriate exercise.	Murmor or uneven heart beats (arythmia); faster or slower rate of BPM than normal.

Check	Your Pet Is Good To Go	How You Can Help	Your Pet Needs To Go To The Veterinarian
Lungs	Clear inhalation and exhalation. 10 - 30 Beats Per Minute for Medium to Large Dogs 20 - 40 Beats Pet Minute for small dogs and cats	Get regular veterinary check ups and appropriate exercise.	Labored or difficult breathing; raspy; muffled, congested; rate higher or lower than normal.
Privates	Clean, No discharge, normal size.	If pet can't reach, clean with soft, warm damp cloth	Red, unusual discharge; swollen
Tail	Shiny coat, no lumps, or bumps		Hair loss, open sores, lumps/bumps
Habits	Good energy level and appetitie; doesn't drink water excessively; regular bathroom habits	Feed high quality and age appropriate food; provide fresh, clean water and proper exercise.	Lethargic; loss or increase of appetite / thirst. Change in bathroom habits - more or less frequent "accidents", vomit or diarrhea.
