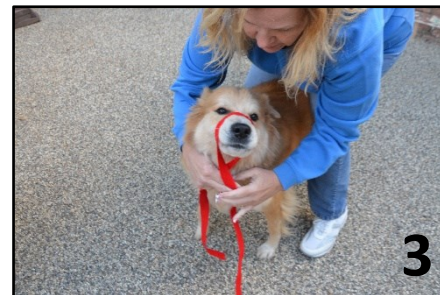
MUZZLING

STEP 1 – Make a loop in the center of the fabric strip

STEP 2 – Slip loop over snout and pull snug

STEP 3 – Cross ends of strip under chin and pull tightly to close mouth

STEP 4 – Bring ends of fabric around sides of face (like reins on a horse) and tie in a bow behind neck

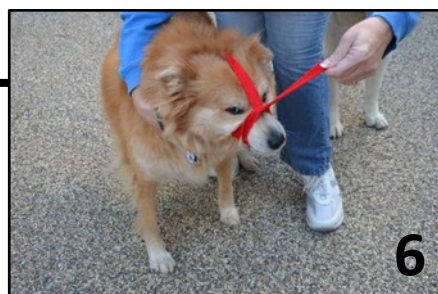
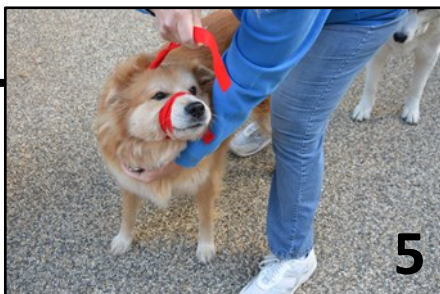


For added security...

STEP 5 – Instead of tying bow loops, after you secure at neck with a “right over left,” bringing longest end between ears over crown of head

STEP 6 – Tuck end under loop previously made on snout, and...

STEP 7 – Finish by bringing both ends together and tying off in a bow pulling muzzle closer toward forehead. Preferable tie behind neck, but if fabric strip isn't long enough, tie where you can.



ADDITIONAL IDEAS (Tube Sock/Paper Cup)
